As followers of Jesus, we want to know how to read Scripture in a way that makes a tangible difference in our lives. We want to know how the inspired texts can be personal, helpful, challenging, comforting and life-changing.

Fortunately, we can achieve this without having to master new, creative methods for making the Bible more relevant to life today. Rather we will find the means to fulfilling this desire in one of the most ancient treasures of the Church: the spiritual practice of *lectio divina* (sacred reading).

But lectio divina is not a rigid system or a set of required steps for reading the Bible. Rather, it is a way of approaching the sacred text with faith, openheartedness, reverence, and expectation. The reader trusts that God is present and speaks to His people through the inspired word, working profoundly within our minds and hearts.
