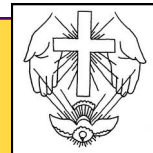

Stewards of the Church



Stewards of God’s gifts are not passive beneficiaries. We cooperate with God in our own redemption and in the redemption of others. We are also obliged to be stewards of the Church—collaborators and cooperators in continuing the redemptive work of Jesus Christ, which is the Church’s essential mission.

This mission—proclaiming and teaching, serving and sanctifying—is our task. It is the personal responsibility of each one of us as stewards of the Church. All members of the Church have their own roles to play in carrying out its mission:

Parents who nurture their children in the light of faith;

Parishioners who work in concrete ways to make their parishes true communities of faith and vibrant sources of service to the larger community;

All Catholics who give generous support—time, money, prayers, and personal service according to their circumstances—to parish and diocese programs and to the universal Church.

Act For A Consistent Ethic Of Life
