To Be A Christian Steward

"As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied grace" (1 Pt 4:10).

A Stewards Way

The life of a Christian steward models the life of Jesus. It is challenging and even difficult in many respects, yet intense joy comes to those who take the risk to live as Christian stewards. Women and men who seek to live as stewards learn that "all things work for good for those who love God" (Rom 8:28).



After Jesus, we look to Mary as an ideal steward. As the Mother of Christ, she lived her ministry in a spirit of fidelity and service. She responded generously to the call. We must ask ourselves: Do we also wish to be disciples of Jesus Christ and Christian stewards of our world and our Church? Central to our human and Christian vocations, as well as to the unique vocation each one of us receives from God, is that we be good stewards of the gifts we possess. God gives us this divine-human workshop, this world and Church of ours. The Spirit shows us the way. Stewardship is part of that journey.

Ten Principles Of Civil Communication:

Defending the Faith without Raising Your Voice—and Losing Friends

Whether around the family table, the office water cooler, the neighborhood barbecue, or even on Facebook, we can remove obstacles to evangelization, to the sacraments, to Christ. We can defend our Catholic faith without raising our voices.

1. *Look for the positive intention behind a criticism. When you encounter people who are critical of the faith, rather than focusing on their arguments, consider the value to which those arguments appeal. Look for the (sometimes buried) Christian ethic or idea behind the value.*
2. *Shed light, not heat. As Christians we are called to shed light on difficult topics and represent the Church. If you come to the discussion to shed light rather than heat, your emphasis will be completely different. Stay calm. This composed approach may just disarm and open a door to the light of faith, which illuminates everything. (cont. in next bulletin)*
