A 2022 award-winning book, Broke In America: Seeing, Understanding and Ending U.S. Poverty by Joannie and Samuel Goldblum and Colleen Shadox offers an eyeopening and galvanizing look at life in poverty in this country. It illuminates how circumstances and public policies keep people poor and the concrete steps citizens can take to transform policies, structures, and systems to give people lives of dignity and security, the aim of Catholic Social Teaching.

Demon Copperhead by Barbara Kingsolver is a fiction book that vividly portrays life in poverty in the U.S. through the personal story of a young boy in Appalachia. Using a compelling first-person narrative, Kingsolver delves into the various issues highlighted in Broke In America. Written as a modern day David Copperfield, Kingsolver follows Dicken's motives as she writes to explore how our social systems impact children and adults living on the margins.

WHAT ARE THE FRUITS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT?

"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law. Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit. Let us not become conceited, provoking and envying each other." Galatians 5:22-26



LOVE - To love with a God-like love, unconditionally, and vigorously, not counting the cost, not being based on mere reciprocity. It is wanting only what is good for the other.

JOY - The joy referred to here is more than a passing worldly joy. It is deeper than an emotional experience. It is rooted in God and comes from Him. Since it does not have the world for its origin but, rather, comes from God, it is more serene and stable than worldly joy which is merely emotional and lasts only for a time.

PEACE - This is normally used in the Greek Bible to translate the Hebrew word shalom. This sort of peace is more than an absence of conflict. Rather it is the presence in the human person and their relationships of everything that should be there.

PATIENCE - This fruit of the Spirit causes us to be more willing to suffer the difficulties of life and of other people. We are less needful to avenge wrongs and slights and are more able to endure the imperfections of people and this world. By this fruit we can forebear the crosses, miseries, and difficulties of this world. (continued in next bulletin)
