SELF-CONTROL - One who have

mastered their love and desire of pleasure. There is a place in life for pleasure and desires. Without them we would perish. Since the fall of man however, our desires are often inordinate and excessive. There is need for the virtue of selfmastery that moderates and regulates them.

MODESTY - Refers to observing a proper reverence for mystery in terms of the body. Hence more private areas of the body are clothed in such a way as to keep hidden what is appropriately unveiled only in certain places or before certain people. Modesty would also include things such as posture, behaviors related to the comportment of the body and language.

<u>GENEROSITY</u> - Generosity is defined as noble in behavior or actions; principled, not petty; kind, magnanimous. It is willing to give and share unsparingly, showing a readiness to give more (especially money) than is expected or needed.

CHASTITY - Refers to the virtue wherein we exhibit proper sexual expression based on our state in life. For the single person, the member of a religious order and the priest it involves total abstinence. For the married person it involves total fidelity to one's spouse. (*continued in next bulletin*)
