
It is quick and easy to set up. You pick the amount of your offering and the frequency of your donation. At the end of the year you can print out your donation record for use with your tax filing.

The Psalms - The Bible's Prayer Book

Hymns of Thanksgiving - It is natural for people to express thankfulness to God for their blessings. Individuals thank God for help and deliverance in Psalms 40 and 63. Ps 107 is a community thanksgiving for human deliverance from many troubles, as well as gratitude for many blessings. Psalm 65 thanks god for the earth's bounty, while Psalm 103 expresses gratitude to God for His overwhelming goodness. Psalm 138 thanks God for being present: "I give thee thanks, O Lord,/ with all my heart" (v. 1). Praying with these thanksgiving psalms can be part of our expression of gratitude to God.

Laments - A lament is an expression of prayer for help, coming out of a deep feeling, or an experience of pain. More than one third of the psalms are either individual or communal laments. It is normal to cry out in pain when we are hurt physically. When we are hurt emotionally or spiritually, we cry out in a prayer of lament. The lament psalms are expressions of the psalmist's profound ache to God. "Out of the depths, I cry to thee, O Lord! / Lord, hear my voice (Ps 130:1). "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" (Ps 22:1). In a lament, the very core of a person praying is in deep turmoil. "My soul, also, is sorely troubled. / But thou, O Lord—how long?" (Ps 6:3). When we lament, like the psalmist, we ask God heartfelt questions that bubble up out of our deepest feelings. "How long, O Lord! Will Thou forget me forever?" (Ps 13:1). "Why do you stand afar off, O Lord?/ Why do you hide yourself in times of trouble?" (Ps 10:1). These are cries of pain born of sickness, loneliness, alienation, and abuse. They are revelations of chaos, brokenness, suffering. They are not requesting God to provide information. Rather these psalms are the psalmist's pleas, as well as ours, to have God be with us in our suffering.
