The Psalms - The Bible's Prayer Book

Jesus and the Psalms (continued from previous bulletin)
In the Gospel of Luke, from the cross, Jesus prays part of
Ps 31:5: "Into Your hands I commit My spirit." Jesus would
have known the rest of the Psalm, which says "But You have
redeemed Me, O Lord, faithful God." In the Gospel of John,
when Jesus cries out from the cross, "I am thirsty," we are
immediately reminded of Ps 22, where the psalmist speaks and
says his mouth is dried up like a potsherd, and his tongue sticks
to his jaws (see v. 15). Or we remember Ps 69, "For my thirst
they gave me vinegar to drink," (v. 21). In sum, from birth to
death, Jesus' life was formed by the Psalms. We ae likewise
challenged to be open to the psalms and to let them touch our

Pastoral Letter for the Jubilee Year of Hope - Christ Our Hope

Christ is our hope. Sixty years after the closing of the Second Vatican Council, which brought about the missionary renewal of the Church to bring the joy and hope of Jesus Christ to the modern world, Pope Francis has called a Jubilee Year of Hope (December 24, 2024-January 6, 2026). a hope in Jesus Christ that does not disappoint.

The Year of Hope continues the work of the New Evangelization inaugurated by the pastoral renewal of Vatican II and particularly implemented by the pontificate of St. John Paul II. In the previous ordinary Jubilee Year celebrating the 2000th anniversary of the incarnation of Jesus Christ, St. John Paul II invited the Church to embrace the new millennium with a deep missionary renewal. At the end of that Jubilee Year, he encouraged the Church to enter the Third Millennium as a missionary Church inspired with hope:

Let us go forward in hope! A new millennium is opening before the Church like a vast ocean upon which we shall venture, relying on the help of Christ. The Son of God, who became incarnate two thousand years ago out of love for humanity is at work even today; we need discerning eyes to see this and, above all, a generous heart to become the instruments of His work. Did we not celebrate the Jubilee Year in order to refresh our contact with this living source of our hope? Now, the Christ whom we have contemplated and loved bids us to set out once more on our journey: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." (Mt 28:19) The missionary mandate accompanies us into the Third Millennium and urges us to share the enthusiasm of the very first Christians; we can count on the power of the same Spirit who was poured out at Pentecost and who impels us still today to start out anew, sustained by the hope "which does not disappoint."
