# **Encountering Christ Our Hope**

Pope Francis gave us a clear vision for the Jubilee Year of Hope (December 24, 2024-January 6, 2026): "For everyone, may the Jubilee be a moment of gratitude, personal encounter with the Lord Jesus, the 'door' of

our salvation, whom the Church is charged to proclaim always, everywhere and to all as 'our hope." (diocs.org)

#### Assisting our Parishes to be Beacons of Light

For the New Evangelization to be effective in bringing the hope and joy of Jesus Christ to our modern world, our parishes need to be centers of evangelization and missionary discipleship. The spiritual culture of the parish must be constantly renewed in two fundamental directions. The first is a renewal that is internally focused on personal conversion and transformation to become like Christ. The second is a renewal of being outwardly committed to sharing in the mission of Christ and the evangelization of the culture and community within which the parish exists. This is a great challenge for parishes today that requires a commitment for a renewal of vision and mission. "Today in America as elsewhere in the world the parish is facing certain difficulties in fulfilling its mission. The parish needs to be constantly renewed on the basis of the principle that 'the parish must continue to be above all a Eucharistic community.' This principle implies that 'parishes are called to be welcoming and fraternal, places of Christian initiation, of education in and celebration of the faith, open to the full range of charisms, services and ministries, organized in a communal and responsible way, capable of utilizing existing movements of the apostolate, attentive to the cultural diversity of people, open to pastoral projects which go beyond the individual parish, and alert to the world in which they live". (Ecclesia in America) Have I ever thought about the parish as more than just the place I attend Mass—as a 'home base' where Christian community is formed and from which we go out on mission to the world? What concrete steps could I take to help my parish fulfill this mission?

#### Sacred Heart Devotion

"According to the Popes of the last 100 years, there is no devotion more important to the life of the Church than devotion to the Heart of Jesus," theologian Dr. Robert Stackpole tells us. But why?

#### Welcome Him into your home.

Now, if the only Sacred Heart devotion you do is faithfully perform the First Fridays of Reparation, your doing a lot. But there is another easy step you can take, one that shows true love of Jesus and will help console His Heart even more. Enthrone the Sacred Heart Image in your homes, and venerate it regularly.

When we welcome an image of our Lord into our homes, we are inviting our Lord into our lives, our families and our hearts. It's like having a picture of your family members in your house. Even if they're not physically present, the picture means you're reminded of them regularly, you're keeping them in mind, and they are there in your heart. Keeping pictures of loved ones is a sign you care. But how do we venerate Jesus in the Sacred Heart image?

A simple bow of the head and an act of love towards Jesus and His Sacred Heart are sufficient, although some people recommend occasionally giving the Sacred Heart of Jesus a kiss as you pass the Image. If you can do it safely, light a votive candle before the Image, especially when you have a particular intention or you just want to show your love for Jesus. Maybe have flowers before it, as well.

Remember: When you enthrone an image of Jesus in your home, you've welcomed a beloved family member. Consider all the little gestures of love you would make to such a beloved family member, and then do them for Jesus.

It must be pointed out that the Image itself is simply paint, canvas, and wood. We aren't directing our love to the physical painting. We are showing our love to the One whom the Image depicts.
