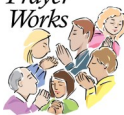

Declaring Saints—How the Canonization Process Works

From its earliest days, the Catholic church has celebrated the memory of some of her members known for heroic examples of faith, hope, and charity, and has acknowledged the outstanding holiness that existed in them. The first Christians most readily heralded as saints were those who suffered martyrdom and were killed in hatred of the Faith. In subsequent generations, the church held up as saints those who modeled heroic Christian living. A central reality of the Catholic Faith is that all the baptized are called to be saints, an idea underscored and articulated anew by the Second Vatican Council as the “universal call to holiness.”

For centuries before there was a process of canonization, saints were declared by popular acclaim. But through the centuries, a process for naming saints developed and was codified. Over time, the prerogative for elevating someone to sainthood came to rest solely on the See of Rome. In 1983, however, Pope St. John Paul II overhauled the process and the result is what guides the Church today.

Because a specific procedure must be followed to prove that the person in question is in heaven, the road to canonization has a juridical quality to it. The final step of the process is the Pope’s solemn declaration, during the canonization rite, which states the given individual is in heaven. *(continued in next bulletin)*
