Declaring Saints—How the Canonization Process Works

Most Common Path: A Virtuous Life - Through beatification, provision is made for the person to be venerated on a local level - perhaps in a given diocese, or nationally, or in a religious community and their apostolates, etc. Churches may be dedicated in the blessed's honor in the specific locations associated with their life or work, and they are assigned a liturgical memorial to be celebrated in places associated with blessed's life. In recent years, beatifications also have been locally celebrated, usually in a place where the beatified person lived or died.

Canonization is a declaration that the individual is in heaven and enjoys the beatific vision. The canonization takes place in a liturgy celebrated by the Pope, most typically at the Vatican. It is an infallible act of the magisterium that is to be definitively held by the faithful that an individual is now a "saint." When a person is canonized, their cult is spread throughout the whole Church by inscribing their name in the canon, or official list, of saints. The saints may or may not be included on the General Roman Calendar. Regardless, they are invoked publicly and may be liturgically celebrated and have churches dedicated to their memory anywhere in the world. A proven miracle is needed for all individuals who are canonized. But, at times, the Pope has dispensed of the need for a final miracle. *(continued in next bulletin)*

Greetings! My name is Father Prasanna Mese, a missionary priest from the Diocese of Kurnool in southern India, where I was ordained in 2010. After serving for ten years in Texas (2012-2022), I returned to my home diocese to continue ministering to the faithful. I want to share with you the realities and needs of the Catholic community in India.

Our mission addresses significant challenges, including:

Providing free education to over 1,500 impoverished children.

Offering medical assistance and housing to the disadvantaged.

Fostering the self-empowerment of women.

Carrying out evangelization efforts.

In India, Christians are a minority, with Catholics making up only 1% of the population. Our diocese has 155 priests and 438 religious sisters dedicated to serving the poor. Additionally, many young men and women are currently discerning their vocations as future priests and nuns.

I invite you to learn more about Catholicism in my home country. I hope this information is both enlightening and inspiring. Thank you for your kind attention and generosity.
